

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ACCOMMODATION POLICY

All international students must live in one of the following types of accommodation.

- ◆ With their parents
- ◆ With a designated caregiver
- ◆ In an approved homestay

Homestay students live with a family and experience New Zealand family life. They have their own room where they can work. All meals are supplied and students will join in with family activities.

Living in a homestay is an excellent way in which to improve English language skills and to enjoy life in New Zealand.

All homestays are approved by the school's *Accommodation Agent* and the School to make sure that they meet the standards required by the *Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students*.

Homestay fees are negotiated with the School's **Accommodation Agent** as part of the required **Guardianship Agreement**.

- ◆ With parents or legal guardians (proof of legal guardianship must be supplied).
- ◆ With a designated caregiver chosen by their parents / legal guardians. All accommodation offered by designated caregivers must be approved by the school, as required by the *Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students*. An indemnity form nominating the designated caregiver must be completed by **the parents** and returned to the school.
