Class Placement and Learning at our School

We use information provided by parents and each students' previous school to place students in home classes with others who are learning at the same level. This clustering of students at various levels across classes, enables teachers to differentiate the learning for individual students within their class. Children with special abilities are accelerated in home classes and through the Friday Academic High Performance Classes, while students with additional needs are supported in class and through a range of intervention programmes.

Our school approach is to strengthen each student's emotional resilience and develop their interpersonal skills within a variety of social contexts. All classes are heterogeneous in their structure, enabling students to interact with peers from a variety of backgrounds. This is all at the same time as they have their learning accelerated regardless of the academic level they enter our school with.
