

Participation in the 2021 Digital Classes

In 2020, by purchasing a Chromebook for your child to use in a digital class at our school, you are also agreeing to adhere to the following conditions for bringing a Chromebook for use on the school network:

- You are agreeing to purchase a **Chromebook** that meets school specifications.
- You are agreeing for Dynamo6, our school technicians, to monitor the applications and extensions used by your child on our school network.
- You are agreeing not to install applications or extensions at home or school that may cause harm to our school network or cause legal implications such as illegally downloading or viewing movies or music.
- You are agreeing to ensure no file sharing applications or extensions are installed on your child's Chromebook. Exceptions are personal or school Google Drive, or similar personal storage such as Dropbox.
- You are agreeing to pay an annual Chromebook technical support fee of \$100.00 to the school. This is to enable the Dynamo6 technicians to administer the Chromebook on the school network. This includes updates and solutions to minor problems. Any hardware faults will be covered by warranty.
- You are agreeing to put in place safe procedures as to how your child will transport their Chromebook to and from school.
- You are agreeing to take responsibility for recording the Chromebook's serial number and other relevant details for warranty purposes.
- You are agreeing to have the power supply checked regularly to ensure your child's safety.
- You are agreeing to monitor and take responsibility for your child's use of the Chromebook, particularly with regard to accessing and using internet sites.
- You are agreeing to the school's right to withdraw your child's right to have a Chromebook at school if they breach the school's internet use rules and rules for electronic communications (these will be given to all families at the beginning of the year).

As a school we will:

- Provide your child with a school-based Google account, which will provide access to curated resources, applications and extensions useful for meeting student learning goals and needs.
- Group Digital Class students together within home classes.
- Provide an instructional programme that will enable your child to regularly use their Chromebook as a tool for learning.
- Have your child's Chromebook secured in a locked classroom during all breaks.
- Provide regular monitoring and maintenance of the software installed on the computer.
- Provide your child with guidelines for the use of the Chromebook and looking after peripherals like the battery to prolong the life of the device.
- Instruct your child on the School Internet Use Policy and Policy on Electronic Communications.

Chromebooks should be ready for use in class by the second full week of classes in 2021.

Note: Second-hand Chromebooks that meet our minimum specs are acceptable.

Recommended Chromebook Models:

CURRENT RECOMMENDED MODELS AS OF JUNE 2020:

Acer Chromebook C733 or the Lenovo 100E

Note: There is currently a worldwide shortage of Intel CPU chips for Chromebooks.

We would not recommend purchasing until later in 2020, when new models become available.

New Model launch: **Acer:** September. **HP:** G range August. **Lenovo:** 100e by August.

Approximate Launch product period. Availability in stores, yet to be announced.

Minimum Specs:

ChromeOS: Memory: 4GB RAM **Storage:** 16GB SSD, **Wi-Fi:** recommended AC or higher.

Other devices:

Only Chromebooks will be acceptable in our digital classrooms.

Reliability, speed, security, longer battery life and ruggedized models will help reduce demands on our teachers and technical support team.

Broadband Fast Internet:

Students will need after school access to broadband/fast Internet, so they can:

- Keep their student Chromebook up-to-date and secure.
- Utilise the Internet for online learning.
- Use cloud-based features (files stored at Google Drive).
- Chromebooks have limited offline capability; they need an Internet connection to be activated.

To use the device, prior to the start of the academic year, a personal Google account is required.
